

# Fu Jen Catholic University Regulations Governing the Pope John Paul II Scholarship

Approved by the President on May 27, 2004

Passed by the Second Meeting of the Management Committee for Financial Aid for the Second Semester of the 2011-2012 Academic Year

## **Article 1: Objective**

This scholarship was established to recognize students whose behavior reflects the mission statement, objectives, and characteristics of the University, and who strive to manifest the five core elements of holistic education: the moral, the intellectual, the physical, the social, and the aesthetic.

## **Article 2: Scholarship Value**

Each recipient will receive NT\$50,000.

## **Article 3: Recipients**

The scholarship will be awarded to five students (this includes students at the School of Continuing Education).

## **Article 4: Eligibility**

A current student at the University who displays outstanding moral conduct, has excellent grades, serves as a model to peers, and meets one of the following conditions may be recommended as a scholarship candidate:

- (1) Has demonstrable achievements in supporting the University, providing service, and caring for the wider community; provides a good example to youth.
- (2) Behavior reflects the mission statement, objectives, and characteristics of the University.
- (3) Wins prestige for the University through outstanding performance at an off-campus competition or activity.
- (4) Diligently pursues studies, displays modesty, has demonstrable achievements in academic research, and receives the praise of instructors and fellow students.

## **Article 5: Required Documents**

- (1) Application form.
- (2) Academic transcripts from previous academic year.
- (3) Letters of recommendation from two instructors. (No restrictions on letter format.)
- (4) Brief personal biography.
- (5) Documents that prove eligibility.

## **Article 6: When to apply**

Applications should be made during the first semester of an academic year. Deadlines will be announced by the Office of Student Affairs.

## **Article 7: Selection procedure**

- (1) Students at the Day Division should complete the application form, prepare all

necessary documents, and provide them to the director and dean of their home program for written endorsement before the deadline specified in regulations. The application form and documents should then be sent to the College of Medicine and the three founding administrative agencies of the University: the Chinese Diocesan Clergy Mission Office, the Jesuit Mission Office, and the Divine Word Office. Students at the School of Continuing Education should send the application form and documents to the evening office at the Office of Student Affairs.

- (2)The selection procedure will be decided by individual programs, but should include the participation of the head of the program and related instructors. The procedure must be transparent and use objective criteria for selecting a student to be recommended for the scholarship.
- (3)The three founding administrative agencies, the Dean of the College of Medicine and the Director of the School of Continuing Education should provide their written endorsement on the finalized list of scholarship recipients and send it to the Student Life Division at the Office of Student Affairs. The list will then be announced by the President.

#### **Article 8: Awarding Method**

The scholarship money and trophy are awarded every year during a public celebration for the anniversary of the founding of the University.

**Article 9** These regulations have been passed by the Management Committee for Financial Aid and will be promulgated and implemented after approval from the President. The same procedure will be followed for each amendment.
