

Fu Jen Catholic University Regulations Governing the Hsiang-hsi

Kung Scholarship for Low-Income Students

Approved by the President on February 22, 2001

Approved by the President on March 5, 2009

Approved for amendment by the Sixth Executive Council for the 2011-2012 Academic Year on March 8, 2012

Article 1: Origin

Hsiang-hsi Kung was an ardent patriot and a leader of youth; his integrity and accomplishments are held in high regard by citizens of the Republic of China. As a principal, he provided constant care to his students, teaching them to persevere, study diligently, and serve the nation. His son, Ling-kan Kung, donated funds to the University to establish the Hsiang-hsi Kung Scholarship for Low-Income Students to fulfill his father's final wishes.

Article 2: Objective

This scholarship is intended to help students from a low-income household attend university and to provide the necessary financial aid to disadvantaged students so that they may complete their studies.

Article 3: Recipients

Any student of the University studying at the undergraduate level may apply if they come from a family whose financial difficulties negatively affect their ability to continue attending university and can provide documentation of low-income status.

Article 4: Source of funds

Scholarship funds are provided by the interest accrued annually on the Hsiang-hsi Kung Scholarship Fund. The principal itself may not be used. Any extra interest will be invested back into the principal.

Article 5: Recipients

The number of recipients is determined by the interest accrued to the fund for that academic year. Based on the proportion of students at individual colleges and the School of Continuing Education, the Student Life Division will select recipients and award the scholarships.

Article 6: When to apply

Applications should be made during the second semester of an academic year.

Article 7: Required documents

- (1) Application form.
- (2) Academic transcripts for previous semester.

- (3) Documents showing low-income status.
- (4) Photocopy of student's Chunghwa Post Office bank book.

Article 8: Awarding times

Scholarships will be awarded once the names of recipients are announced.

Article 9: Application procedure

Individual colleges will process and review applications. Students who meet the requirements stated in these regulations should deliver all necessary documents to their adviser. An adviser may also encourage a student to apply and then provide assistance in making the application. Once the adviser has provided written endorsement, they will pass the application to the program director for endorsement. Afterwards, the college secretary will provide the Student Life Division with a list of students who have passed review. This will be done by the evening office at the Office of Student Affairs for students at the School of Continuing Education.

Article 10 These regulations have been passed by the board of directors for the Hsiang-his Kung Scholarship Fund and sent to the President to be promulgated and implemented upon approval. The same procedure will be followed for each amendment.
